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# MATHEMATICA MORAVICA

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## INSTRUCTIONS FOR AUTHORS

Papers submitted for publication may be written in English. The text should be concise. As a rule, papers exceeding 15 type-written pages, will not be published. Manuscript must be typed double-spaced, on one side of the page only. Under the title, name(s) of the author(s) should be given, at the end of the paper the full name (with official title, institute or company affiliation, etc.) and exact address should appear. Each paper should be accompanied by a brief summary (50-150 words) in the same language and in Serbian (not obligatory for authors), together with the translation of the title, and by 1991 *Mathematics Subject Classification* numbers. Footnotes in the text should be avoided if at all possible.

References should be listed alphabetically at the end of the manuscript, in the same way as the following examples (for a book and a paper in a journal):

- [1] J. Schwartz: *Nonlinear Functional Analysis*, Gordon and Breach, New York, 1969.
- [2] J. Karamata: *Sur un mode de croissance régulière des fonctions*, *Mathematica (Cluj)*, 4 (1930), 38–53.

References should be quoted in the text by giving the corresponding number in square brackets.

Manuscripts in above form should be submitted in triplicate to a member of Editorial Board of the *Mathematica Moravica*. Once the manuscript has been completed it will be preferable if the author submits his manuscript in electronic form using  $\text{\TeX}$ . This will help accelerate the publication of the manuscript submitted.

A total of 30 reprints of each paper will be available free of charge.
